Priority	What It Means	Example Fixes
Critical	Screen readers cannot read the document.	Add a text layer, tag the document structure, embed fonts.
High	Major barriers for users with disabilities.	Add document title, write alt text for images, fix heading order.
Medium	Significant barriers, but some workarounds exist.	Add table headers, replace raw URL link text, add bookmarks.
Low	Minor issues that are good to fix.	Add author metadata, set document language, review empty pages.
